Audiological Services



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IESDB and Outreach Student Services

The Audiology Department at ISDB is located in the Department of Special Services.

The ISDB audiologist provides comprehensive testing which includes:

- **impedance audiometry**
- **puretone aid and bone testing**
- **speech audiometry**
- **visual reinforcement audimetry**
- **auditory brainstem response**
- **ASSR testing**

Other Services:

- **adjustment of hearing aids**
- **making earmolds**
- **acoustical analysis of hearing aids**
- **real ear measurement**
- **central auditory processing testing**
- **assistive listening devices**
- **other specialized testing**

Medicaid:

Medicaid will be billed for the cost of ear molds and hearing aid repairs *if the child is eligible on the date of service*. The cost of ear molds and hearing aid repairs not covered by Medicaid is the responsibility of the parent or guardian. A Healthy Connection referral is needed.

Open Clinic, Upon Referral

- Children Ages Birth to Twenty-One
- Open Clinic is available—Fall through Spring of each school year

As a no-cost service, the ISDB audiologist conducts audiological evaluations upon referral. The audiologist requests that the referral source contact the Department of Special Services to refer the child. The parent or guardian can then contact the Department of Special Services to schedule the appointment during “Open Clinic” hours. Because of its popularity, Open Clinic appointments fill quickly, resulting in a waiting period. If the reason for referral is considered medically related, referral sources are encouraged to have the parent contact their family physician.
